A MESSAGE FROM FATHER NILO

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Prayerful greetings to you! We are now on the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The stewardship way of life could be described as a daily pursuit of the kingdom of heaven. Today's readings show us the critical importance of recognizing the kingdom of heaven in our midst and prioritizing our lives in order to obtain it. In our First Reading, from the First Book of Kings, God appears to Solomon in a dream and invites Solomon to ask Him for something he desires. Rather than asking for riches or power, Solomon asks for the gift of "an understanding heart... to distinguish right from wrong." In other words, he asks God to help him discern what is true and therefore what really matters in life. It is no surprise that God is pleased to give him this gift and that Solomon has been known since then as the wisest of kings. God will give the same gift to us if we ask Him sincerely. And in fact, we must have a wise and understanding heart if we are to live the stewardship way of life, to guide our priorities and decision making in matters big and small. When we pursue Godly — rather than worldly - priorities, we can do so with great peace because, as St. Paul reminds us in the Second Reading, from Romans, "all things work for good for those who love God and are called according to his purpose." All things — not just the major, life-altering decisions, but the countless tiny ones we make on a daily basis as we strive to serve the Lord and advance the kingdom of heaven. In our Gospel passage from Matthew today, we arrive at the conclusion of three weeks of Jesus' teaching on the kingdom of heaven. In the first of today's parables, our Lord reminds us that living for Him and for His kingdom will be costly. But the deep joy that comes in following Him makes the "price" entailed worth it. Jesus says, "The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field which a person finds and hides again, and out of joy goes and sells all that he has and buys that field." Next, He says the kingdom of heaven is "like a merchant searching for fine pearls. When he finds a pearl of great price, he goes and sells all that he has and buys it." In each of these stories, the kingdom of heaven is somewhat "hidden." We must intentionally search for it amidst the noise of the world that bombards us. We need wisdom to recognize it. Yet, our Lord reminds us that His kingdom is meant for everyone and He wants us to find it! He says, "It is like a net thrown into the sea which collects fish of every kind." But Jesus concludes His teaching with a rather ominous image, reminding us that every "fish" will also be judged as good or bad. "The angels will go out and separate the wicked from the righteous and throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth." This is a description that is difficult to forget. Clearly Jesus wants to get our attention. Let us pray for the wisdom to recognize the kingdom of heaven in our midst and intensify our efforts to pursue it starting right now. There is no time to lose, and we will obtain the immeasurable joy that only comes when we live as disciples of Jesus. As part of our renewed life as disciples and an act of gratitude, let us always be ready in looking after the needs of those around us. Charity begins at home. "THOUGHT" - FUL CORNER

Thank you to those who have shared a book or article with the office. We hope to receive more in the future. One of the books that was shared with me was "The Generosity Habit – How Daily Giving Can Change Your Life and Transform The World". written by Matthew Kelly – How Daily Giving Can Change Your Life and Transform The World". The preface of the book states "Don't just love, astonish people with your love. Don't just dabble in generosity, live a life of staggering generosity." The book describes the Generosity Habit as a simple process - Give something away every day. The author tells us that is doesn't need to be big or fancy or attention worthy. He defines the philosophy behind the generosity habit by one singular truth – We don't need money or material possessions to live a life of staggering generosity. He shares 17 perspectives on the Generosity Habit beginning with "The World needs Changing". Matthew Kelley acknowledges that everyone can agree on the fact that the world is in need of profound change-but what is that change going to stem from - "politics, education, law, economics, technology or something else" All of these aspects of society should serve human flourishing, but unfortunately, the human quest for more, bigger, faster and better seem to have taken us off course. Kelley believes that generosity has the potential to bring out the best in people. He encourages us to discover what it means to be authentically human as he suggests that "it is the very best of our humanity that the world needs right now." I challenge you to consider this until next time "What are you trying to accomplish in your day to day life? Are you living a life of staggering generosity? What would you need to do to make this change in your life? 😳
