# "Stop and consider God's wonders"

A devotional practice which has become a tradition for many Catholic families over the years is participation in a pilgrimage during the summer months. Pilgrimages usually take place at a church or shrine, where pilgrims gather for the day or in some cases camp for a few days, around the time of a special feast day. Pilgrimages usually involve a journey of some sort, with some pilgrims walking for long distances to the pilgrimage site, then praying and singing together, receiving the sacraments of Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick, celebrating Eucharist, participating in candlelight rosary processions or the Way of the Cross, hearing talks or homilies on religious topics, and sharing food and stories with relatives, friends and fellow pilgrims. Most of the shrines and pilgrimage sites are dedicated to the Virgin Mary, although some are dedicated to saints or local holy people.

#### Lac Ste Anne Pilgrimage

For several days each July, thousands of pilgrims make their way to the shores of Lac Ste Anne, a site west of Edmonton where indigenous people have gathered for many years. Many come in search of healing and spiritual renewal. Some simply come to reconnect with old acquaintances and forge new friendships.

This pilgrimage, which began over a hundred years ago, has become one of the largest annual Catholic gatherings in Western Canada. The 2017 Lac Ste Anne Pilgrimage runs from **Friday**, **July 21 to Thursday**, **July 27**. The week includes daily Mass, testimonies, healing prayers, and youth and children's programming. #### Skaro Pilgrimage – August 14 – 15, 2023

In the year 1918 the early Polish settlers built a shrine in the memory of Our Lady of Lourdes. To this day the shrine attracts thousands of pilgrims from all over Alberta to the annual Skaro Pilgrimage. Each year the pilgrimage begins on August 14, with Reconciliation at 6:30 p.m., followed by Rosary at 7 p.m., Vespers in Polish at 7:30 p.m., and Mass at the Grotto (in English) at

8 p.m., presided over by Archbishop Smith. A beautiful candlelight procession of the Blessed Sacrament follows the blessing of religious articles. On August 15, at 10 a.m. there is a special Mass at the Grotto with the Sacrament of the Sick.

Food is available for purchase before the Vigil Mass on the 14th and after the 10 a.m. Mass on the 15th.

The Skaro Shrine is 80 km northeast of Edmonton, at the intersection of Highway 45 and Secondary 831.

#### **Oblate Mission Hill Pilgrimage**
