My dear friends and parishioners,

A blessed summer to all of you!

The month of August is dedicated in venerating the Immaculate Heart of Mary. A loving heart which is the cause why the Incarnate Word was conceived in her womb and finally was made flesh and dwelt among us, Jesus. A virgin's heart totally in love not to the created things of this world but to the Creator, author and lover of life. This month of August has several Marian feasts in her honor, namely: August 2, feast of Our Lady of the Angels (Refuge of Sinners), August 5, Dedication of St Mary Major, & Our Lady of the Snows, August 13 Dormition of the Blessed Virgin Mary, August 15 Feast of the Assumption, August 21, Our Lady of Knock of Ireland & August 22 Feast of the Queenship of Mary, August 25 Our Lady Health of the Sick, August 26, Our Lady of Czestochova, Queen of Poland August 27 Feast of the Seven Joys of the Blessed Virgin Mary, etc. Let us entrust our pilgrimage of faith to the Blessed Virgin Mary and also amidst this pandemic as Health of the Sick. May her maternal care and miraculous intercession, may we find relief, consolation and solution to our problems as she crushed the head of the ancient diabolical serpent, satan. Our Lady Help of Christians whose Immaculate Heart is burning for the care and love of us all, your children, pray for us.

This month's readings should inspire the Christian steward with deepened gratitude to our God Who loves us with such fierce and tender love. We must make an intentional response every day to return love for Love. Like Mary in her "Magnificat", song of praise: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior..."

In the book of prophet Isaiah, we hear God calling to us, even trying to entice us, to come and be filled with the good spiritual food He wants to give us. "Come, receive grain and eat; Come, without paying and without cost, drink wine and milk!" And, "Heed me, and you shall eat well, you shall delight in rich fare." Note that He uses the word "heed" in that verse and then repeats it in the next, "Come to me heedfully, listen, that you may have life." We must be intentional in going to God on a regular basis through prayer and the sacraments. We must "heed" and "listen" to receive the nourishment He want to give us. We must choose Him — above our selfishness, above the worldly diversions that surround us constantly. But if we seek Him intentionally, we can be sure He will reward us: "I will renew with you the everlasting covenant, the benefits assured to David."

And we can have complete confidence in this promise of His faithful love. From the Letter to the Romans, St. Paul reminds us emphatically that nothing and nobody can keep God from loving us. No anguish, distress, persecution, famine... and we might add pandemic, economic loss, relationship strife — nothing — can keep our

God from His faithful love for us. His love is so powerful that not only does it allow us to survive all these things and more, but, "in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly." God has got us in the palm of His hand.

And yet, this assurance is only the beginning of God's gifts to us. The Gospel passage from Matthew recounts the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fish. This of course, is a foreshadowing of the miraculous gift the Eucharist, which feeds us not with bread but with the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus. This is so marvelous to contemplate that it is tempting to skip right over the beginning of the passage to get to the miraculous part. But let's look at the first verses of this passage, for they reveal a little of the tender heart of Jesus for all of us.

As the passage begins we find that Jesus "withdrew in a boat to a deserted place by himself." He had just heard of the death of His cousin John the Baptist and was attempting to find a few moments of solitude. But the crowds would not leave Him alone. They followed him and tracked him down. Yet, our Lord was not frustrated with their interruption.

Rather, "his heart was moved with pity for them, and he cured their sick." What generous and compassionate love He shows. But even that is not enough for our Lord. He remains with the people, ministering to and teaching them well into the evening. The disciples suggest that Jesus should send them away so that they could buy some food. But Jesus will not hear of it. He insists that the disciples feed them right then and there. And then, He provides the miraculous abundance of food out of the few loaves and fishes the disciples could round up.

What a privilege for those disciples to participate in Christ's miraculous plan for His people. This privilege is ours, too, as Christian stewards. Let us make a grateful response to such amazing love. Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us. Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us. Amen. Keep safe, keep well, keep healthy and strong, keep holy in the Lord. God bless and protect you all!
