Getting to know Alberta's Catholic Post Secondary Education Community

The story of University level Catholic Education in Alberta is one where lay and religious leaders ensured Catholics had access to robust education in the service of both the Church and society. Thanks to those historical efforts, Alberta now boasts two Catholic Colleges and a Catholic University, where students at all stages of their journeys can seek out the advantage of Catholic post–secondary education. As the three Presidents of these institutions, we want to share the success of this story, and implore Catholics from all parishes, K–12 Catholic schools, and families, to know the unique gifts you have in Alberta for University level education rooted in faith.

Meet the Presidents of Alberta's Catholic Post-Secondary Institutions



Dr. Sinda Vanderpool *St. Mary's University*

Dr. Sinda Vanderpool

Dr. Sinda Vanderpool assumed the role as the first female and fourth Vice Chancellor and President of St. Mary's University in Calgary, Alberta in 2022. After earning her bachelor's degree in French from Davidson, Dr. Vanderpool attended Princeton University in New Jersey where she focused on 16th Century French poetry through the lens of female identity, completing her PhD in 2005. While Dr. Vanderpool had been consistently interested in questions of

faith in her formative years, it was during her time at Princeton that she immersed herself more fully in the Catholic intellectual and spiritual tradition and felt an invitation to grow deeper faith roots by becoming a Roman Catholic (2006). Dr. Vanderpool began her career after graduate school as a French professor at Baylor University. She then moved up the ranks to become the Associate Vice Provost for enrollment management.



Dr. Shawn Flynn St. Joseph's College

Dr. Shawn Flynn

Dr. Shawn W. Flynn serves as the 19th President of St. Joseph's College, and its first lay president. Flynn earned a PhD at the University of Toronto, is a scholar of the Hebrew Bible and ancient Near East, and has published three monographs and one edited collection with publishers such as Brill, Oxford University Press, and Routledge. An advocate of the Catholic Intellectual Tradition and the conversations between faith and the public sphere, Flynn joins SJC at the heart of

the University of Alberta to promote the Liberal Arts through a Catholic lens in which students can explore religion, faith, and the common good for their own development and the uplifting of society.



Dr. Jason West Newman

Dr. Jason West

Dr. Jason West has been President of Newman Theological College since 2012. He completed his Ph.D. in Philosophy at the University of Waterloo. His academic interests include medieval philosophy, especially Aquinas, and the role of philosophy within theology. His Ph.D. dissertation concerned Aquinas' use of metaphysics in his Christology and he has published several scholarly articles on these topics.

In more recent years his work has focused on the French Catholic philosopher Jacques Maritain. Related to this, he is interested in the appropriate of Aquinas by contemporary Catholic philosophers particularly in the area of political theory (e.g. Alasdair MacIntyre, John Finnis, etc.). He has been a public member of the Council for the Alberta College of Pharmacists since 2020. He and his wife Christine have 6 children.

Uniquely, Alberta has every dimension of Catholic post-secondary education: a standalone Catholic University in St. Mary's University in the south of Calgary, Newman Theological College in Edmonton, and an affiliate College at the University of Alberta, in St. Joseph's College. Each is highlighted below for their main features, unique contributions, and missions. But all three serve a broader goal and are rooted in a common story.

A Church of Universities A History of Education

Research, scholarship, and teaching have always been at the heart of the Church and key to the Gospel. As early as 200 AD, the Church invested in libraries such as those in Alexandria and later in Caesarea. The work of learning is so important to the Church that alongside the saints, we have Doctors of the Church to recognize intellectual contributions. Following from this, Medieval universities, growing out of Cathedral schools, taught Arts, Theology, Law, and Medicine were always in close dialogue with society. We are thus a Church of universities that strengthen the Church and society by those we train, and equip people for a life of service who will work on behalf of the common good.

A Gift for Alberta and Beyond

Rooted in this history, now Catholic higher education is the largest provider of education to the world outside of government sources. In Canada alone, we have 20 Catholic Colleges and Universities. Thanks to this history, now in Alberta, parents and students have all three dimensions of Catholic university level education available to them: a stand-alone Catholic University, a theological College, and an affiliate College at a large research University.

Through these options, students are formed to make the faith their own. While our courses and programs provide career pathways, yes, but primarily they create ways for students to serve the world and the Church. Distinct from catechesis and basic faith formation, we offer an invitation and formation into the Catholic Intellectual Tradition, that benefits all students

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St. Mary's

As the largest of the three Catholic institutions in Alberta, St. Mary's University was founded in 1986 by members of the lay community who wanted a Catholic university in Calgary. With an enrollment of over 1,000 students, it is proud to be the only independent Catholic university in all of Canada that offers full Bachelor's degrees, working closely both with the Diocese of Calgary and Alberta Advanced Education. St. Mary's prepares students to live with integrity, compassion and confidence.



The arts and sciences offerings help students prepare for legal and health careers or to be leaders in business, church, and industry. Program offerings include Bachelor of Arts degrees in English, General Studies, History, Psychology, Liberal Studies, and Social Justice & Catholic Studies. St. Mary's also offers a Bachelor of Science in Biology. St. Mary's is well known across Alberta for our excellent B.Ed. programs, a post-baccalaureate degree offered in both elementary and secondary. Many of Alberta's awardwinning teachers receive their degrees from St. Mary's. St. Mary's also offers a Diploma in Entrepreneurship and Social Responsibility as well as a Diploma in Ministry (for training deacons within the diocese but open to any lay person). Students choose St. Mary's because of small class sizes and because of the mind-body-spirit education it provides.





regardless of their faith. With us, all students are challenged to seek truth in every field of knowledge. In our institutions faith and reason are mutually illuminating. In our classes we recognize a sacramental vision of reality in which truth permeates all of creation. As a result we believe gaining expertise in any field of knowledge from the sciences, to theology, to education, to the humanities is a valid enterprise that worships God. Therefore, we explore the integration across disciplines to speak according to the truth those disciplines reveal. In these ways students resist reductionism and still have confidence in the ability of reason to explore the depths of creation. And yet because of the complexity of knowledge, at our best we model a humbleness in the intellectual life that comes from acknowledging the mystery of what God has created. Students enter this journey to form their lives to address the problems of the world. That is why Catholics and non-Catholics are attracted to our missions. We do all of this with the common feature of attending to and caring for the whole student in their emotional, intellectual, physical, and spiritual well-being. Let us look at the gift that Catholic post-secondary offers through these individual post-secondary institutions.

Newman Theological College

Newman Theological College was founded in 1969, developing out of St. Joseph's Seminary. It was established by Archbishop Anthony Jordan who envisaged Newman as a context for seminarians and laity to mutually enrich each other's studies in preparing to serve the Church. We proudly carry

on this vision today. The M.Div. degree prepares future priests and lay people for collaborative professional ministry. The MRE degree provides teachers professional development in religious education or administrative leadership. Our MTS degree offers students an academic program of study in theology. All of these programs have on-campus and online options for study.

The College's most recent program is the BA in Catholic Studies. This three-year program is accredited through the provincial government. It follows a Great Books curriculum and Socratic seminar pedagogy, offering an educational experience unique in Canada. Finally, Newman offers many opportunities for faith formation through its Certificates in Catholic Studies. These online and affordable courses are offered in over 90 subjects with 22 different specialized certificates. This is a flexible and realistic option for those wanting to know more about the faith, but who may not have time or resources to do a formal post-secondary degree. Newman is a private and independent post-secondary institution and receives no public funding. Our educational mission is funded through fees and our generous donors.







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St. Joseph's College at the University of Alberta

St. Joseph's College originated in 1926, and is the oldest of the three Catholic Colleges. In order for the University of Alberta to successfully launch, and involve all religious groups (rather than create standalone Catholic Universities at the time) it was important that Catholics were in the midst of the public conversations and part of the University project. This is a common story across Canada where many public Universities have affiliate Colleges, many of which have Basilian origins and imprints. For students, the advantage of St. Joseph's College is having the full benefits of whatever program of study or degree they choose at the UofA, while having an academic home on campus where faith and reason can be explored.

Through the Liberal Arts rooted in the Catholic tradition, SJC offers nearly 70 courses per year for credit to students for their UofA degrees. The College serves 2000 yearly enrolments (non-FTE), and has over 360 students living in our men's and women's residences in the heart of the University of Alberta. These students are then supported by Campus Ministry, Basilian priest chaplains, and two chapels, with our own St. Joseph's faculty, staff, President, and Board of Governors, who steward our resources for the benefits of students and their integral development as human persons.







The story of Catholic post-secondary education in Alberta needs to be shared. Every student, parent, teacher, superintendent, principal, parish, Bishop, and school should know what is available when looking into the postsecondary landscape. We ask you to share this widely, and explore which would be right for your family.





Vanier Catholic Community School has a Rosary Club!

At Mass on the first Sunday of Advent, Fr. Thomas invited the congregation to focus on prayer in the weeks leading to Christmas. An idea immediately came to my mind: a Rosary Club. On Tuesday morning, I put in an announcement and invited all students to

come to the Music Room at morning recess to pray the rosary. I think there were two students that first day, then more the next week. After Christmas break, we continued to meet on Tuesday mornings to pray the rosary. Sometimes I ask students if they have prayer intentions. Sometimes I suggest an intention based on what is happening in our school community or the greater community. As we have about 15 minutes, I lead most of the decades and ask for volunteers to lead with Our Father. There is a grade 4 student who leads the last decade; when she wasn't there last week, her sister asked if she could lead it. To set up for Rosary Club, I turn down the lights and turn on three battery-operated candles. I sit on the floor with a large wooden rosary and wait for students to come. Some days there are a few who gather to pray. Some days there are twenty and more. Before we leave the Music Room, I ask those gathered to turn to their neighbours and say, "Thank you for praying with me." I am grateful for this time with students and with the Sunday morning invitation to prayer that inspired the Rosary Club.






