In keeping with the *Day of Truth and Reconciliation,* St. Stephen's is holding a series of meetings in an effort to learn more about the First Nations, Métis and Inuit cultures to further understanding and healing. The first evening will be held on Thursday **October 14<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m.** in the upper room, <u>covid restrictions applying</u>. Entitled "We Remember", it will be an informal gathering to share stories and open communication about the residential schools situation and the ongoing struggle to retain the cultures of our ancestors. All are invited, and please bring your own beverage. Due to the personal nature of the stories, the meeting will not be available on zoom or live streamed. The next session will be on Oct 24, 2021.

#### A MESSAGE FROM FATHER NILO

My dear People of God & parishioners,

Blessings to you and thank you for praying with us daily the Most Holy Rosary this entire month of October! The beauty of Nature during this Fall Season speaks of the beauty, truth and goodness of our Creator God. With the document of Pope Francis, Laudato Si, we are called to become protector, care-taker and stewards of our environment. We are called to fully live a life of good Christian Stewardship. Part of the beauty of stewardship spirituality is its simplicity and practicality. It can be summed up in the simple phrase, "All I have is a gift from God and I must make a grateful return to Him for all He has given me." So simple, that even our youngest parishioners can grasp the concept. Simple, however, does not necessarily mean easy. Simple also does not mean shallow. Today's readings invite us to look into the depth of a stewardship way of life. And they reveal that it requires the commitment of our whole being to God. It is anything but easy or shallow. It points us to seek after higher things — the wisdom of God and Heaven itself.

Our Second Reading, from the Letter to the Hebrews, shows us a way to obtain such wisdom —it is available to us right in the Scriptures, which are the *living* word of God. Every time we approach them in a spirit of prayer, they will speak to us. God's wisdom is right there for us. All we need to do is commit some daily time to seek it. Our Gospel Reading from Mark is one of the better-known passages in the Gospel — the story of the rich young man. In response to the man's question on what he must do to obtain eternal life, Jesus tells him to keep the commandments. The man replies that he has always done this much. But he rightfully suspects there is more to being a disciple of Jesus than just following the external rules. We are called to be so much more than rule-followers; we are called to be Christ followers. A stewardship way of life frees us follow Christ with all of our being and so to find eternal life. A life of simplicity, humility, holiness and detachment are the key ingredients or virtues in following Christ wholeheartedly. To have Jesus Christ at the centre of our life is at the heart of Christian Stewardship. To love the Lord our God above all things and to share in His ministry is the heart beat of our mission. May Christ be our true wealth, salvation, eternal life and who is all in all. God bless you richly!
