What matters is that we keep baby stepping along, assured of the grace we need to more closely imitate the actions and attitudes of Christ. This is the beauty of the stewardship way of life. May the Lord bless those who humbly serving the Lord in various ministries in our parish including those essential volunteers. Today is known as the World Day of Refugees and Migrants, let us pray for those who are distant from their family that they may become missionary disciples of the Lord wherever they are called for service. We humbly pray for their well being as they strive to be contributors to our economic stability and the common good as a nation.

Next month is the month of the Most Holy Rosary, let us pray as a family and we will experience the fruits of being together as family united in prayer especially for protection in this time of pandemic. God bless you all!
